






#### **MASS ATTACKS IN PUBLIC SPACES - 2018**





- Attacks took place in every month except December
- ▶ 59% took place between the hours of 0700-1500

#### **MASS ATTACKS IN PUBLIC SPACES - 2018**



Most common ways attacks ended:

- ▶ Suicide at the scene 26%
- ▶ Departing on their own 26% (42% suicide later)
- ▶ Law enforcement intervention 22% (66% killed)
- ▶ Weapon inoperable 15%
- ▶ Bystander intervention 7%

#### MASS ATTACKS IN PUBLIC SPACES - 2018



- > 78% of attackers exhibited behaviors that caused concern in others
- For 70% of the attackers, the concern others felt was so severe that they feared specifically for the safety of the individual, themselves, or others.

#### **Speak The Responder's Language – ICS**

- ICS may be used for small or large events. It can grow or shrink to meet the changing needs of an incident or event. Use it for a party or picnic to help train your employees!
- Management by Objectives
- Reliance on Incident Action Plan
- Manageable Span of Control
- Pre-designated Locations and Facilities
- Resource Management
- Integrated Communications

- Chain of Command, Command Unity & Transfer
- Accountability
- Mobilization
- Information and Intelligence Management
- Incident Demobilization

### **Employee Training**

- No Tailgating
- Challenge unknowns
- Run, Hide, Fight Move, Escape, Attack
- Cover vs. concealment
- No fish in a barrel
- ▶ Shhh...
- Learn to stop the bleed
- Add bleed kits to first aid kits

### **Employee Training**

- Only pull a fire alarm if you see a fire
- Know the fire alarm shutoff location
- ▶ Keep empty hands up on search and evacuation

- Understand how firearms work
- ▶ Train to disarm an attacker

#### **Tourniquets Save Lives**



- Tourniquets are an effective way to control major hemorrhage from severe limb injury
- Never use a tourniquet when direct pressure will work



- 1. Put it on and tighten until loss of pulse or blood stops
- 2. Record time
- 3. Do not remove under any circumstances


























### **San Bruno Police Department**




- Public/private safety group created in 2015



#### **Best Practices – Law Enforcement**



- 1. Mutual aid
- 2. Tactical training for all officers
- 3. Command post siting
- 4. Invite private sector reps to command post
- 5. All personnel need to check in and out at the command post
- 6. Command vehicles need lots of flat surfaces
- 7. Tourniquets, bleed kits & bleed training
- 8. Fire alarm shutoff location
